



Tit Nest Box from
Cheep Nestboxes
Guidelines



Location

Try to choose a quiet part of the garden out of reach of potential predators (e.g. cats) and mount the box on a tree or the side of a building.

Do **NOT** place any nestbox close to a bird-table or feeding area. The regular movements of many other birds are likely to prevent breeding in the box.

Height

Whether fixed to a tree or a wall (e.g. garage, house, shed, etc.), the height above ground is not crucial to most species of bird, as long as the box is clear of inquisitive humans and potential predators (i.e. cats).

Aspect

If no natural shelter is available (e.g. if the box is mounted on an exposed building-side), it is best sited facing between north-west and north-east if possible, in order to avoid strong direct sunlight and the heaviest rain. The box should be tilted slightly forwards so that the roof deflects rain away from the entrance.

Annual cleaning

After the end of each breeding season (ideally in October or November), your nestbox should be taken down and the old nesting materials removed (using gloves for personal hygiene) and the box scolded with boiling water to kill any parasites. Do **not** use insecticides or flea-powders.

IMPORTANT

Under the terms of the Wildlife and Countryside Act, if un-hatched eggs are found in the box, they can only legally be removed from October to January inclusive, and they **MUST** then be destroyed:

IT IS ILLEGAL TO KEEP THEM!
